# Need for reform of research assessment

- To reflect **evolving research processes**
  - ✓ Digital transition; Iterative and recursive; Collaborative and open
- To reflect **increasing demands on research**
  - ✓ Societal, environmental, economic challenges; Diversity of outputs
- To move away from **inappropriate uses** of journal- and publication-based metrics
  - ✓ Rewards quantity and publication venue rather than quality; does not reward sharing, collaboration and outputs other than publications
- To further support the **quality of research** and the **attractiveness of research environments**
  - ✓ Requires a system and cultural change, involving institutions, funders and researchers

# International initiatives

- San Francisco Declaration on Research Assessment, DORA (2013)
  - ✓ Recommendation to not use journal-based metrics, such as Journal Impact Factors, as a surrogate measure of the quality of individual research articles
- The Leiden Manifesto for research metrics (2015)
  - ✓ Best practice in metrics-based research assessment
- Hong Kong Principles for research assessment (2019)
  - ✓ Principles to strengthen research integrity
- Dutch initiative « Room for everyone's talent » (2019)
  - ✓ Specific actions taken by Dutch public knowledge institutions and research funders

# Political context

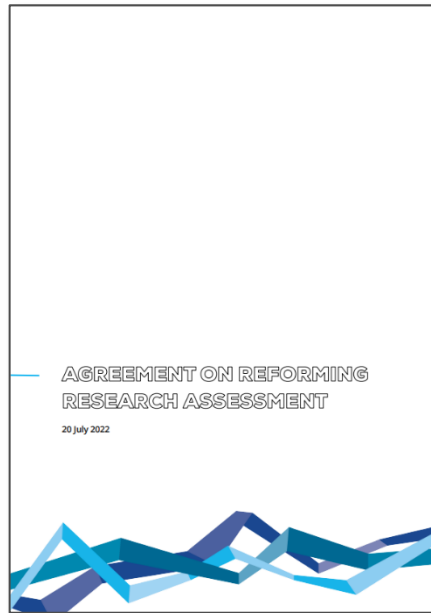
- **Sep 2020** - **Commission Communication on ERA** proposed to improve the research assessment system
- **Council Conclusions on ERA** - **Dec 2020** - and on research careers - **May 2021** - invited the Commission to work with stakeholders to effect change
- **Nov 2021** - **Council Conclusions** on the Future Governance of the ERA and the **ERA Policy Agenda 2022-24** include a priority action on reforming research assessment
- **Feb 2022** - EU Presidency conference on open science and **Paris Call on Research Assessment**
- **June 2022** - **Council Conclusions on Research Assessment and Implementation of Open Science**

Signatories start the process of **reviewing or developing criteria, tools and processes** in line with the Agreement principles and commitments

# Common vision

Assessment of research, researchers, and research organisations, **recognises the diverse outputs, practices and activities** that maximise the quality of research and resulting impacts.

This requires basing assessments primarily on **qualitative judgement**, supported by **responsible use of quantitative indicators**.

## Signatories agree to:

- ✓ Base actions on **10 Principles**
- ✓ Implement **10 Commitments** for change
- ✓ Follow a common **timeframe** for implementation
- ✓ Organise and operate the **Coalition** as a space for **mutual learning and collaboration** that supports and facilitates the implementation of the Commitments by the members, while respecting their autonomy

# 10 commitments

## Core commitments:

1. Recognise the **diversity of contributions to, and careers in, research** according to the needs and the nature of the research
2. Base research assessment **primarily on qualitative evaluation** for which peer-review is central, **supported by responsible use of quantitative indicators**
3. **Abandon inappropriate uses** in research assessment of journal- and publication-based metrics, in particular inappropriate uses of journal impact factor (JIF) and h-index
4. **Avoid the use of international rankings of research organisations in research assessment**

## Support commitments:

- Three commitments to **pilot** and enable the move towards **new criteria, tools and processes** for research assessment
- Three commitments to facilitate **mutual learning, communicate progress** and ensure that new approaches are **evidence-informed**

# Timeframe

Agreement includes touch-base points in years 1 and 5 after signature to communicate progress, based on **self-assessment**.

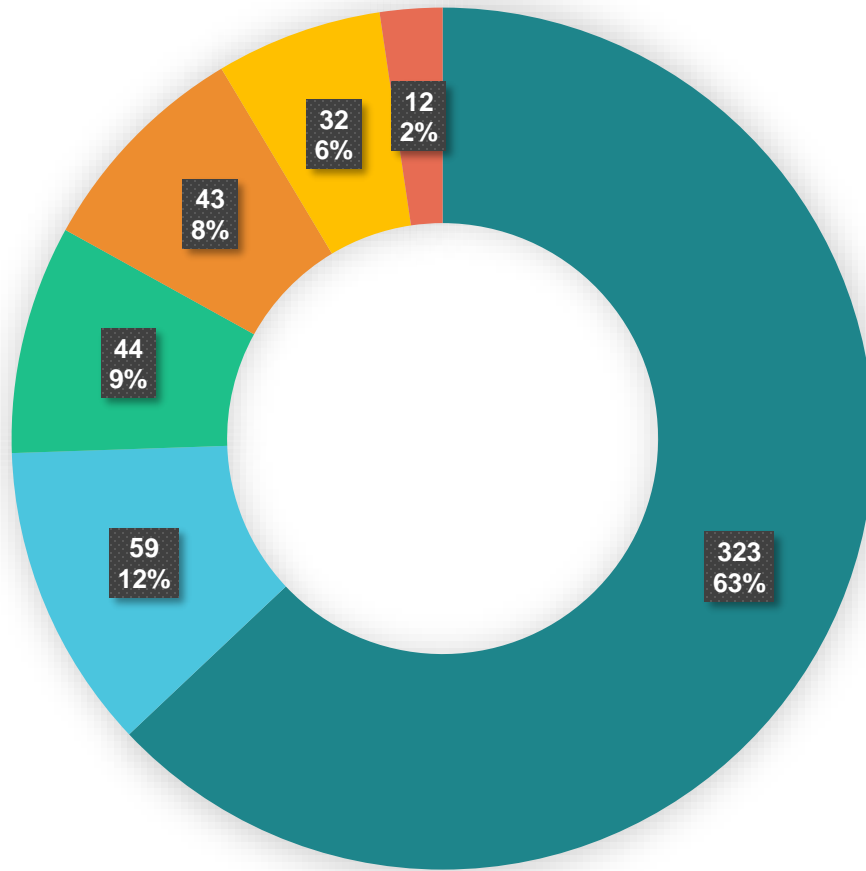
- **By year 1** signatories will have shared how their organisation **has started the process of reviewing or developing criteria, tools and processes** in line with the core Commitments and **according to an action plan with defined milestones**.
- **By year 5** signatories will have worked through **at least one cycle of review and development of their assessment criteria, tools and processes**



# Key considerations

- **Flexible and evolutive**: assessment practices can vary according to the context, type and purpose of the evaluation
- Respectful of the **autonomy** of organisations and of their respective missions.
- Quantitative indicators: **responsible use**, not abandoning them
- Special attention to and involvement of **early career researchers**
- The agreement is only the starting point: changes to be developed and implemented by CoARA members

# Agreement signatories – Type of organisation



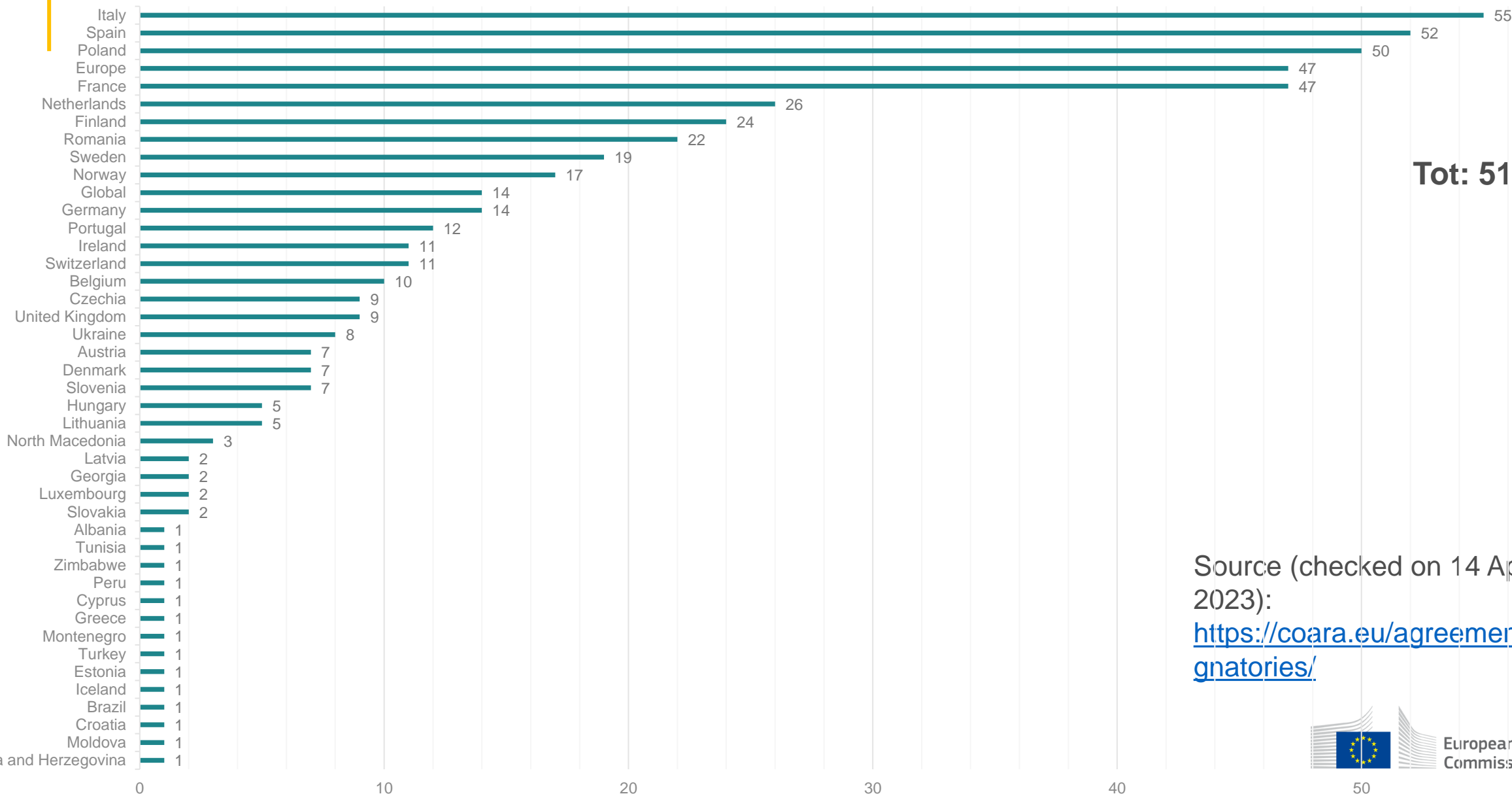
- Universities and their associations
- Research centres, research infrastructures, and their associations
- Academies, learned societies, and their associations, and associations of researchers
- Public or private research funding organisations and their associations
- Other relevant non-for-profit organisations involved with research assessment, and their associations
- National/regional authorities or agencies that implement some form of research assessment and their associations

# Coalition for Advancing Research Assessment (CoARA)



- Launched at the Constitutive Assembly on 1 December 2022
- Offering a space for **mutual learning and collaboration** that supports and facilitates the implementation of the Commitments by the members, while respecting their autonomy
- **Working groups** to be established on specific topics as '**Communities of practice**' e.g. "Interest communities", "Discipline communities", "Institution communities", as well as **National Chapters**

## First Call for Working Groups and National Chapters

For the first time CoARA is asking its members to propose Working Groups and National Chapters.

- **Opening:** 28 March 2023
- **Deadline:** 6 June 2023 ( ⚠ but mandatory intermediate deadline to submit an « Expression of Interest » until 27 April)
- Open to **CoARA member organisations**
- Topics to be proposed **bottom-up** by members
- WGs to be **inclusive**: different types and sizes of organisations, geographical areas, and wide range of experience levels
